HUD Announces Application Due Date for Emergency Safety Grants

HUD’s Office of Capital Improvements (OCI) has [announced](#) that it is now accepting applications for the fiscal year (FY) 2024 Emergency Safety and Security Grant (ESSG) program. PHAs may submit applications through Wednesday, **March 27, 2024**. According to the document, HUD expects to fund \$10 million in the capital fund grants this year. “Although the Consolidated Appropriations Act for 2024 has not been enacted yet, in past years, not less than \$10 million has been set aside for necessary safety and security measures to address crime and drug-related activity, fire safety, and the threat of carbon monoxide poisoning in public housing”. Funding will become available once the FY24 Appropriations Act is passed.

On April 21, 2023, HUD issued Notice [PIH 2023-10](#), which sets forth the annual funding notification and application process for the ESSG program. The notice remains in effect until amended, superseded, or rescinded. Per paragraph 4 of the notice, HUD is now accepting applications for the FY24 ESSG program. Paragraph 7 of the notice is revised by the [application submission notification](#). Additionally, HUD has streamlined the lottery and review process as described in the notification document.
