HUD Announces Upcoming NFHTA Courses

Yesterday on the [HUD Exchange News](#) webpage, the Department of Housing and Urban Development ([HUD](#)) [announced](#) that the registration for the next National Fair Housing Training Academy ([NFHTA](#)) courses is open. Click on the following links for more information on each course, submit a registration request, and begin the enrollment process:

- [Fundamentals of Fair Housing – Intake](#): This course covers best practices in fair housing intake for the Fair Housing Initiatives ([FHIP](#)) and Fair Housing Assistance ([FHAP](#)) programs staff. It will provide an overview of the responsibilities and customer service orientation to conducting intake. November 27-30, from 1:00 to 4:00 p.m. Eastern time.
- [Litigating Fair Housing Cases](#): A course designed for those who are involved in FHIP and FHAP litigation to understand and apply the methods and strategies for effective fair housing enforcement. December 5, 7, 12, 14, from 1:00 to 4:00 p.m. Eastern time.
- [Basics of Fair Housing](#): This course ensures that FHIP and FHAP participants have a foundational framework, which they can build upon to carry out their duties in a professional and proficient manner. December 18-21, from 1:00 to 4:00 p.m. Eastern time.

Note that submitting a registration request does not confirm eligibility to attend the course. Participants must meet all eligibility requirements and fully complete the two-step registration to be enrolled in the course.

The NFHTA was launched in July 2019 to prepare fair housing advocates, lawyers, investigators, and other stakeholders on effective strategies and techniques for addressing discriminatory housing policies and practices throughout the nation.



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
