HUD Announces Training Series on Lead Safe Housing Rule Amendment

On the <u>HUD Exchange News webpage</u>, HUD's Office of Lead Hazard Control and Healthy Homes (<u>OLHCHH</u>) <u>announced</u> a series of trainings on the Lead Safe Housing Rule (<u>LSHR</u>) Amendment. The trainings will review federal lead regulations and discuss the LSHR amendment for pre-1978 housing. Presenters will provide a step-by-step explanation of how PHAs, grantees, and owners respond to cases of elevated blood lead levels (EBLL) in children less than six years old living in a federally assisted housing unit.

The trainings are relevant for PHAs, grantees, and owners involved in tenant-based rental assistance (TBRA), conventional public housing programs, and project-based assistance (PBA). PIH Publishes Main Street NOFA

Yesterday HUD's Office of Public and Indian Housing (PIH) posted at <u>Grants.gov</u> the notice of funding availability (NOFA) for the <u>HOPE VI Main Street</u> grants program for fiscal year 2022. The NOFA makes available approximately \$1,000,000 in funding "to provide grants to small communities to assist in the renovation of an historic or traditional central business district or 'Main Street' area by replacing unused, obsolete, commercial space in buildings with affordable housing units." The application deadline date is **January 31, 2023**.

Although PHAs are not eligible for HOPE VI Main Street funding, local governments with a population of 50,000 or less that are not served by a PHA (or other entity) that administers more than 100 physical public housing units may apply for grants under the NOFA.
