HUD Issues Waivers to Build America, Buy America Provisions

Today in the Federal Register, the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) issued three notices regarding waivers of Build America, Buy America (BABA) provisions as applied to recipients of federal financial assistance.

In the first notice, HUD announced that it is waiving the application of the Buy American Preference (BAP) for all federal financial assistance (FFA) obligated on or before February 21, 2023, with the exception of certain Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds in connection with the purchase of iron or steel products in infrastructure projects. In addition, in the case of FFA obligated by HUD on or after November 15, 2022, but prior to the effective date of the final waiver, HUD is waiving the application of the BAP for all expenditures incurred on or after the date of the final waiver, except for those specific CDBG funds mentioned above.

Similarly, in the second notice, HUD announced that it is issuing a De Minimis and Small Grants waiver of the BAP for infrastructure projects whose total cost (including HUD funding and funding from any other source) is equal to or less than the simplified acquisition threshold, which is currently \$250,000. HUD has also waived the application of the BAP for all Small Grants of FFA provided by HUD that are equal to or below the

simplified acquisition threshold. However, if FFA provided by HUD is combined with other FFA from another federal agency, and the total amount of FFA in a single project is greater than the simplified acquisition threshold, then the waiver does not apply to the FFA provided by HUD. Additionally, HUD has waived the application of the BAP for a De Minimis portion of an infrastructure project, meaning a cumulative total of no more than five percent of the total cost of the iron, steel, manufactured products, and construction materials used in and incorporated into the infrastructure project, up to a maximum of \$1 million.

Finally, in the third notice, HUD announced that it is waiving the BAP for grantees and recipients of FFA from HUD as applied to the iron, steel, manufactured products, and construction materials from BABA in certain exigent circumstances. That is, HUD recognizes that there are exigent circumstances, particularly with respect to the conduct of maintenance and other rehabilitation and repair activities in connection with affordable housing and community development projects, that warrant the exclusion from the application of the BAP in the public interest.

PIH Reminds PHAs of SF-424 and SR-FRB Deadlines

In an email yesterday via HUD's Financial Management Division (FMD) mailing list, HUD's Office of Public and Indian Housing (PIH) reminded PHAs that they must submit their forms SF-424 and, if necessary, HUD-50071 and SF-LLL for the calendar year 2023 operating fund grants by December 16, 2022. You can consult Notice PIH 2017-04 for questions on the applicability of the forms HUD-50071 and SF-LLL. PHAs need to submit all forms through the OpFund web portal. In another email via HUD's Financial Management Division (FMD) mailing list, PIH also reminded PHAs that they must make elections or change requests to Small Rural Frozen Rolling Base (SR-FRB) by December 16, 2022, as well. HUD Updates Special Purpose Vouchers FAQs for MTW Agencies

The Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has updated its frequently asked questions (FAQs) on special purpose vouchers (SPVs) administered by Moving to Work (MTW) agencies. The 14-page document, dated December 2022, covers various topics related to SPVs, such as MTW fungibility, applying MTW program flexibilities, new SPV types including Emergency Housing Vouchers (EHV), and reporting requirements for SPVs.
