HUD to Host Webinar on New Radon Policy

On the <u>HUD Exchange News</u> webpage, the Department of Housing and Urban Development (<u>HUD</u>) announced that it will be holding a webinar to provide an in-depth review of HUD's new <u>policy</u> for addressing radon in the environmental review process. Under the policy, published on January 11, 2024, radon gas must now be considered in the contamination analysis required under HUD's environmental regulations.

The webinar, which will take place on February 27, 2024, from 3:00 to 4:30 p.m. Eastern time, will allow time for questions and answers. Attendees will also be able to submit questions in advance when they <u>register</u>.
