#### **HUD Announces FY 2023 Capital Fund Program Awards**

In a <u>press release</u> last Friday, the Department of Housing and Urban Development (<u>HUD</u>) announced that it has awarded \$3.16 billion to nearly 2,770 PHAs under the Capital Fund Program (CFP) to build, renovate, and/or modernize the public housing stock in their communities. PHAs receiving CFP formula awards are located in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Guam, Puerto Rico, and the U.S. Virgin Islands. ## **HUD Awards Over \$38 Million in Healthy Homes Production Grants**

In another <u>press release</u> last Friday, HUD announced that it has awarded over \$38 million to city, county, and Native American tribal governments, and nonprofit organizations in 17 states to protect children and families from home health hazards. The funds, provided through the Healthy Homes Production Grant program, will help grantees identify and mitigate health and safety hazards in low-income families' homes.

# **HUD Publishes Proposed Waiver to BABA Provisions in Federal Register**

Last Friday we <u>reported</u> that HUD <u>issued</u> a new public interest waiver that delays the implementation of the Build America, Buy America Act (<u>BABA</u>) requirements for most of its programs until 2024. Today HUD has officially published the <u>proposed waiver</u> in the *Federal Register*.

Comments on the proposed waiver are due on or before **March 2**, **2023**. HUD will consider comments received and announce any subsequent changes to the waiver through a later notice.



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
