President Signs First Fiscal 2024 Appropriations Package

On Saturday, March 9, 2024, President Joe Biden signed into law the [Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2024](#), which provides full-year funding through September 30, 2024, for departments and agencies of the federal government covered by six of 12 appropriations bills, including Transportation and HUD (T-HUD). The \$460 billion package provides HUD programs with over \$70 billion, approximately 13 percent higher than the FY 23 allocation. The bill includes:

For the tenant-based rental assistance:

- \$28.491 billion for HCV HAP renewals
- \$337 million for new Tenant Protection Vouchers (TPVs)
- \$2.771 billion for administrative fees
- \$743 million for the renewal of Mainstream Vouchers
- \$15 million for new HUD-VASH vouchers
- \$30 million for new Family Unification Program (FUP) vouchers, including Foster Youth to Independence program vouchers.

For public housing:

- \$5.476 billion for the Operating Fund
- \$25 million for the Operating Fund Shortfall Funding
- \$3.2 billion for the Capital Fund formula grants
- \$65 million in Capital Fund competitive grants
- \$30 million for emergency capital needs
- \$15 million for the cost of administrative and judicial receiverships

For self-sufficiency programs:

- \$141 million for the Family Self-Sufficiency
- \$15 million for the Jobs Plus Initiative
- \$40 million for Resident Opportunities and Self-Sufficiency (ROSS)
