HUD Awards Nearly \$2.5 Million in Disaster Funding

In a [press release](#) last Thursday, the Department of Housing and Urban Development ([HUD](#)) announced that it has awarded nearly \$2.5 million to assist individuals impacted by recent hurricanes and severe storms who are experiencing homelessness or at risk of becoming homelessness.

The funds, provided through the Rapid Unsheltered Survivor Housing (RUSH) program, will be allocated to the states of North Carolina, South Carolina, Texas, and the city of Houston to address needs not otherwise served or fully met by existing federal disaster relief programs.

According to the announcement, in addition to the RUSH allocation, HUD-supported technical assistance providers continue to offer both remote and on-the-ground support to impacted jurisdictions and homeless assistance providers to help them better serve those in need.
