PD&R to Hold Quarterly Update Event on Source of Income Discrimination

HUD's Office of Policy Development and Research ([PD&R](#)) has announced that it will be holding a [quarterly update event](#) focused on source of income discrimination and laws. According to the announcement, "over the past two decades, evidence of discrimination against housing choice voucher holders has grown. More than half of voucher households live in states and localities that have adopted ordinances to prevent this kind of discrimination." The event will bring together researchers, municipal and state government officials, and fair housing practitioners to share insights into the recent passage of local antidiscrimination ordinances, evaluate research about the impacts of these antidiscrimination laws, and discuss challenges to the enforcement of these ordinances.

The quarterly update event will be held virtually and in person at HUD Headquarters in Washington, D.C., on Thursday, July 25, 2024, from 2:00 to 4:00 p.m. Eastern time. For more information, click [here](#). To register, click [here](#).

HUD Awards \$51 Million to Address Youth Homelessness

In a [press release](#) last week, the Department of Housing and Urban Development ([HUD](#)) announced that it has awarded \$51.1 million in Youth Homelessness System Improvement ([YHSI](#)) grants to 38 communities across 26 states, Puerto Rico, and Guam. The grants will support selected communities in either improving an existing response system for youth homelessness or establishing and implementing a new response system.
