PIH Issues Reminder for Timely 50058 Submissions

In an [email](#) this morning via HUD’s Financial Management Division (FMD) [mailing list](#), HUD’s Office of Public and Indian Housing (PIH) reminded PHAs that they must submit actions recorded on lines 2a and 2b in the forms HUD-50058 no later than 60 calendar days from the effective date, and all actions must be recorded **no later than July 30, 2024**, for consideration for the CY 2025 Operating Funds grants.

PIH uses the HUD-50058 data reported in the IMS/PIC between July 1, 2023, to June 30, 2024 (“the reporting period”) to determine CY 2025 Operating Fund eligibility. PHAs must update IMS/PIC with correct data including field office approval on allowable vacancies before July 30, 2024.
