# **HUD to Host Training on Rate Reduction Incentive Application Submission**

In an email this morning via HUD's Financial Management Division (FMD) <u>mailing list</u>, HUD's Office of Public and Indian Housing (<u>PIH</u>) reminded PHAs that it is hosting a training on how to submit rate reduction incentive (<u>RRI</u>) applications through the RRI module in the Public Housing Portal.

The module provides PHAs with the ability to create and submit RRI applications to receive HUD approval in order to claim an RRI incentive on form HUD-52722 each year. PHAs must submit RRI applications between August 19 and September 30, 2024. No RRI applications or documentation will be accepted after September 30.

The training will take place on Monday, August 26, 2024, at 1:30 p.m. Eastern time. Click <u>here</u> to join.

### **HUD Posts VMS Reporting Requirements Webinar Recording**

On the Moving to Work (MTW) Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) Resources webpage, the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) posted the recording for the webinar "Voucher Management System (VMS) Reporting Requirements for MTW Public Housing Agencies" that was held on June 10, 2024. The presentation slides had been previously posted.

The webinar reviewed Notice <u>PIH 2024-11</u>, which describes new reporting requirements for planned uses of MTW HCV reserves in the VMS, the HCV utilization methodology formula for MTW PHAs, and how and when MTW agencies must report on any commitments and obligations in the VMS.

# **HUD Awards \$3.7 Million to Help Low-Income Seniors Age in Place**

In a <u>press release</u> yesterday, the Department of Housing and Urban Development (<u>HUD</u>) announced that it has awarded more than \$3.7 million to two nonprofit organizations and a local housing authority through HUD's Older Adults Home Modification Program (OAHMP). The funds will be used for low-cost, low barrier, high impact home modifications that will reduce older adults' risk of falling, improve safety and accessibility, and enhance their functional abilities in their homes.

These investments will enable older adults to remain in their homes rather than move to nursing homes or other assisted care facilities. The grantees will deliver home modification services to more than 525 senior families. You can find a breakdown of the funding at the bottom of the press release.



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
